

## Lena LAVINAS (brief CV)

Lena Lavinás is currently Professor of Welfare Economics at the Institute of Economics at the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro. She holds a PhD from the University of Paris. She teaches Welfare Economics, Comparative Approaches of Social Protection Systems, and Methodologies for Public Policy Assessment for graduate and undergraduate students. Most of her research focus on: 1) the assessment of public policies such as poverty reduction programs, notably cash transfers schemes, and technology interventions; 2) the impacts of social policies decentralization; 3) comparative analysis on welfare regimes in Latin America; 4) the reforms of the social protection system worldwide; 4) demographic changes and labor market issues, focusing on gender issues. She has been appointed member of the Academic Board of NEPO-UNICAMP (Institute for Demography and Public Policies) from 2005-2009, as well as member of the Editorial Board of *Feminist Economics* (FE -2002-2010). From 1993 to 2000, she worked as Senior Economist, at the Social Policy Direction, at the Institute of Research in Applied Economics (IPEA), at the Ministry of Planning, Brazil. She has been Senior Social Policy Analyst at the ILO from 2000 to 2003.
